Dear Most Precious Blood Family.

On behalf of Father Glenn, the parish staff and myself, I would like to take this opportunity to wish you all a happy anniversary. This year marks 20 years since our parish was first formed in Oviedo, led by Fr. Stephen Parkes (now Bishop Parkes, Bishop of the Diocese of Savannah). Since the beginning, our parish has had a reputation for being a place of tremendous hospitality, energy, passion and faith. We have picked up many new amazing parishioners along the way and our church continues to exhibit this beautiful culture. Thank you to all who serve in so many ways; I hope the Holy Spirit has revealed to you the blessing you are to our community.



As we are about to begin a new liturgical year it is time once again to discern how the Lord might be calling each of us. This particular year is special, in that the Church has declared 2025 to be a Jubilee Year, giving us the theme, "Pilgrims of Hope". What a beautiful theme for our parish community who knows what it means to journey together through challenges, as we strive for heaven and seek to be a light for the world!

All Jubilee years invite us to repentance, confession, grace and healing. How might we respond in a particular way to this year being dedicated to "Pilgrims of Hope"? In considering this I read the Papal Bull, Spes non confundit, which institutes the Jubilee and wanted to share part of it with you: Saint Paul is a realist. He knows that life has its joys and sorrows, that love is tested amid trials, and that hope can falter in the face of suffering. Even so, he can write: "We boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope" (Rom 5:3-4). For the Apostle, trials and tribulations mark the lives of those who preach the Gospel amid incomprehension and persecution (cf. 2 Cor 6:3-10). Yet in those very contexts, beyond the darkness we glimpse a light: we come to realize that evangelization is sustained by the power flowing from Christ's cross and resurrection. In this way, we learn to practice a wirtue closely linked to hope, namely patience. In our fast-paced world, we are used to wanting everything now. We no longer have time simply to be with others; even families find it hard to get together and enjoy one another's company. Patience has been put to flight by frenetic haste, and this has proved detrimental, since it leads to impatience, anxiety and even gratuitous violence, resulting in more unhappiness and self-centeredness...A renewed appreciation of the value of patience could only prove beneficial for ourselves and for others.

In addition to this, Pope Francis gives quotations from St. Francis, describing our need for a renewed sense of awe and engagement with both nature and our fellow humans. In other words, the Pope is using this idea of patience to invite us to slow down and live more deeply. It is an invitation to engage both God and one another more intentionally. It may be a first step to the gift of hope. Pope Francis writes: Patience, one of the fruits of the Holy Spirit, sustains our hope and strengthens it as a virtue and a way of life. May we learn to pray frequently for the grace of patience, which is both the daughter of hope and at the same time its firm foundation.

We are on the threshold of a new liturgical year. It is time to pray about our commitments, and how we will serve God and our community. How will we be Pilgrims of Hope? As always, on behalf of myself, Fr Glenn, and the parish staff, we love you, pray for you, and look forward to another exciting year of journeying together.

How will you share the gifts and blessings God has given you?

Jesus calls us to be missionary disciples...

to come and follow him and actively share in His mission. Sitting back and quietly doing the minimum required of our faith is not enough. It never was, and never will be. Jesus calls us to action and involvement. Now is the time. The Lord is calling you to help build His Kingdom. Right here. Right now. So take this book and look through it. Pray about it. Think about it. Discuss it with your family and friends and make the decision to give something a try. There is something for every type of interest, for every amount of time.

How is the Lord calling you to serve?

In your search for the right ministry, don't limit yourself to just one specific area. Sometimes an opportunity looks great on paper, but the reality is quite different. Try to visit ministry events and get a feel for what they are like. Pray to the Lord for guidance and reach out to the ministry leader or staff liaison for that area of parish life if you have specific questions about one or more ministries.

How to find the right Ministry?

There are numerous ministry opportunities available. The key is to find a ministry that you would enjoy and are capable of doing. It's also important to make sure that your commitment matches what that ministry calls for. The following questions can help you discern:

- ~ Do you prefer to serve alone or as part of a team?
- Are you better behind the scenes or do you prefer to take a more visible role?
- ~ How much time are you willing to commit?
- ~ How much responsibility are you ready to take on?
- ~ What skills and experiences can you share?

LITURGY AND WORSHIP

LITURGY & WORSHIP MINISTRIES ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR MAINTAINING THE INTEGRITY AND FRESHNESS OF OUR LITURGICAL CELEBRATIONS AND ENSURING THAT THE 'SUNDAY EUCHARISTIC EXPERIENCE' IS THE SOURCE AND SUMMIT OF PARISH LIFE.

ALTAR SERVERS

Altar Servers help serve in liturgy by taking part in processions, attending to the Priest at Mass and at other parish liturgies.

Who: Youth having completed Fifth grade and at least 11 years old, who have received their Baptism and First Communion.

Responsibilities: Assist the priest with the celebration of Mass and other liturgical celebrations to ensure that the liturgy runs smoothly and efficiently.

Time: Approximately one Mass per month as assigned; plus, initial training and ongoing formation.

Talent: An ability to be attentive and reverent at Mass, dependability and punctuality.

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION GUARDIAN

"God dwells in our midst, in the Blessed Sacrament of the altar." - St. Maximilian Kolbe



Eucharistic Adoration is the adoration of Jesus Christ truly present in the Eucharist (Blessed Sacrament). During a time of Adoration, the Blessed Sacrament is exposed in a special vessel called a Monstrance, and people come to worship Jesus through prayer, song, or reverent

silence. Eucharistic Adoration is offered on the First Friday of each month from 10 am (immediately following 9:15 am Mass) until 7 pm, and on Monday evenings unless noted otherwise. Individuals and families are encouraged to come and spend time before the Lord in the Holy Eucharist. Eucharistic Adoration Guardians are required for each hour that the Blessed Sacrament is exposed to ensure Our Lord is never left alone.

WORSHIP LITURGY

AUDIO VISUAL PRESENTATION MINISTRY

The A/V & Sound ministers balance the sound in the room, run the slide projections, record homilies when necessary.

Who: Anyone of High School age and up.

Responsibilities: Arrive early for Mass to ensure the system is running, review the slides, and



check in with the music director. Advance the slides as they are needed during the Mass, and record homilies and special celebrations.

Time: Typically twice a month along with another minister. **Talent:** A passion for assisting with the liturgy through operating sound and visual equipment, as well as, computers.

EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION (EMHC)

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion assist the Priest with the distribution of the Body and Blood of Christ. If you wish to be considered, please contact the Parish Office to complete the required form.

Who: Adults and youth 16 & older. Catholic in good standing who has received the

Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation).

Responsibilities: Respectfully assist the Priest in the distribution of the Eucharist during Mass.

Time: As assigned; initial training and ongoing formation sessions. Ministers will be contacted by the ministry facilitator and scheduled to serve. Depending on Mass selection, ministers usually serve 3 Masses within a two-month period.

Talent: Love and reverence for the Eucharist; ease in public settings. Special Requirement: Diocesan training, local parish training and Safe Environment Training (SET). All volunteers will need to complete SET which consists of a 25minute video and successful completion of an on-line questionnaire. Staff Liaison: Chris Hernandez chernandez@oviedocatholic.org



GREETERS

The purpose of the Greeter's Ministry is to provide a welcoming atmosphere to the parish community. Greeters play a special role by welcoming parishioners into the celebration which is about to take place. Their warm smile and friendly "Hello!" set the tone for the Eucharistic Celebration..



Who: All ages are welcome to participate.

Responsibilities: Greeters provide a warm welcome to our parish and assist with questions and provide information at the welcome table. Greeters are asked to arrive 20-30 minutes



prior to Mass.

Time: Commitment level can vary from one Mass per weekend to one Mass per month. Greeters will be contacted by the ministry facilitator and scheduled to serve on an as needed basis.

Talent: Friendly and outgoing, willingness to embrace and welcome all who come to share in our celebrations.

LITURGICAL ARTS & DÉCOR

The Liturgical Arts & Décor Ministry is responsible for creating a beautiful environment in the Parish Life Center and Chapel for liturgies...especially during Christmas and Easter.

Who: Adults and High School Youth.

Responsibilities: Volunteers are asked to help with the setting up for celebrations. We need volunteers who are willing to sew, iron and help create a prayerful atmosphere.

Time: Varies depending on seasons.

Talent: Attention to detail, creativity, and a willingness to serve. Staff Liaison: Chris Hernandez <u>chernandez@oviedocatholic.org</u>





MINISTERS TO THE SICK

Ministry to the Sick and Homebound is a ministry founded in the Church's rich tradition of pastoral care meant to reach those unable to participate in the Church's life due to hospitalization, suffering from the effects of illness, disability, or the aging process.



Who: Catholic in good standing who has received the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation). A commissioned Eucharistic Minister at least 18 years of age.

Responsibilities: Ministers to the Sick assist Priests in bringing the Eucharistic presence of Christ and His Church to parishioners unable to participate in the Church's life through prayer, sacrament, and pastoral presence. Ministers to the Sick conduct weekly Communion Services at several local nursing and assisted living facilities. Home and hospital visits to parishioners are provided as needed.

Time: Varies depending on assignment and minister availability (can range from an hour a month to two hours a week).

Talent: Compassionate, caring, and loving, willingness to serve the sick and the elderly.



Special Requirements for Ministry to the Sick: Ministers to the Sick are trained and certified lay men and women of the parish who have made a serious commitment to the pastoral care ministry and make a powerful witness to the love and care of God. Fingerprinting/Safe Environment Training (SET). The Diocese of Orlando requires all those 15 years and older to be fingerprinted and complete a background check to ensure the safety of all. In addition to fingerprinting all volunteers working with children and vulnerable populations will need to

complete SET which consists of a 25 minute video and successful completion of an on-line questionnaire. Staff Liaison: Chris Hernandez <u>chernandez@oviedocatholic.org</u>



MUSIC MINISTRY

The Music Ministry directs the liturgical music within our weekly Sunday Masses and various other celebrations. We have a collective goal to lead people to Christ through prayer and song.

Who: Adult Choir- ministers regularly at the Saturday 5:00 pm, Sunday 8:00 am, 10:00 am, 12:00 noon (Spanish) & 5:30 pm Masses. Spanish Choir- ministers regularly at the 12 noon Mass. Duties: Lead the congregation in song and praise and

encourage musical participation by everyone present.

Time: In order to improve the quality of our music every week, we organize rehearsals focusing on two major groups:

instrument and vocalists. All members of the choir are asked to attend a mandatory weekly rehearsal and arrive at least 30 minutes prior to the Mass in which they are scheduled to participate.

Talent: Choir- A clear voice and a good ear. Instrumentalists: Previous training and experience.

Cantors- A skilled solo voice; a deep sense of prayerfulness and reverence for the assembly's sung prayer; a warm and inviting manner.

READERS (Lectors)

Readers help to share God's word by proclaiming the Scriptures at liturgies.

Who: Adults and youth 16 & older, Catholic in good standing who has received the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation).

Responsibilities: Ensure that the Scripture readings are proclaimed in such a way as to prompt careful examination and prayerful listening by the assembled faith community.



Time: Approximately one Mass every month as assigned; initial training; ongoing formation; personal time spent in study and reflection on the Word.

Talent: A love for God's word and a desire to study it more deeply; a clear speaking voice; an ease speaking in front of people; dependability.

USHERS

Ushers provide a comfortable spiritual environment for parishioners to worship. Ushers will assist with seating, the offertory, Communion and the distribution of the bulletin.

Who: Adults and High School Youth. (15 years and up) Responsibilities: To provide a comfortable spiritual environment, assist with seating, the offertory, Communion and the distribution of the bulletin, as well as be attentive to visitors and those with special needs.

Time: Commitment level can vary from one Mass per weekend to one Mass per month. Ushers will be contacted by the ministry facilitator and scheduled to serve. Ushers are asked to arrive 20-30 minutes prior to Mass and remain until the last person exits.

Talent: An outgoing and warm personality; an ability to see Christ in all people; dependability; desire to assist others and contribute to the smooth operation of the Mass.

Special Requirements: Local parish training and Fingerprinting/Safe Environment Training (SET). The Diocese of Orlando requires all those 15 years and older to be fingerprinted and complete a background check to ensure the safety of all. In addition to fingerprinting all volunteers will need to complete SET which consists of a 25-minute video and successful completion of an on-line questionnaire.

EVANGELIZATION

EVANGELIZATION MINISTRIES ENSURE THAT OUR CATHOLIC FAITH IS PROMOTED AND THAT INTERESTED PERSONS ARE PROPERLY INVITED AND WELCOMED INTO OUR COMMUNITY.





ADULT ENRICHMENT STUDIES

Adult Enrichment Studies enable parishioners to join together and grow in faith and fellowship through lifelong formation. We do this by studying and exploring both the Bible and the teachings of our Catholic faith. Gathering in groups provides the opportunity to grow in trust, learn along with other parishioners, and grow as disciples. These gatherings help foster a familiar and personal group setting. Adult Enrichment Study groups are held in the comfort of a parishioner's home who has volunteered to be the host home. Studies and groups are available to parishioners college age and older.

ADULT FORMATION

Welcome to the basics of the faith! There are several opportunities for continued education and spiritual growth in the Catholic Faith for adults. Our Catholicism 101 Sessions are offered at different times throughout



the year. Please see our parish website or bulletin for upcoming session dates. Bring a family member, friend, neighbor; all are welcome! There are also (weekly) daytime and evening Breaking Open the Word sessions sponsored by Men's Fellowship to review the upcoming Sunday's readings. ADULT CONFIRMATION

Perhaps due to family transitions, moves, or any other situations, you were unable to receive this Sacrament of Initiation as a youth. This Confirmation preparation class is for all parishioners **college age and older**. Sessions take place on Monday evenings usually beginning in January and registration is necessary to participate in this class. A current copy of your Baptismal certificate is needed for registration. Contact the parish office for more information.

ANNULMENTS

An annulment is a declaration by the Catholic Church that after careful investigation, shortcomings were discovered in the relationship that prevented it from becoming a marriage. It does not "erase" the civil contract, and it does not render the children illegitimate. It merely states that after thorough investigation, the Church has declared that a marriage, as the Church understands marriage, was not valid. Throughout this process a Priest and our Annulment Advocate assists and ministers to divorced members within our parish community. The annulment process involves prayer, sharing, gathering information, and healing. Annulment Advocates educate and encourage the person as they guide and assist them through the annulment process. BAPTISM PREPARATION

Baptism is a Sacrament through which we begin our initiation into the Church. Parents wishing to have their child baptized into the Catholic Faith need to attend a Baptism Preparation class, and be a registered and participating member of our parish showing Mass attendance for at least 3 months. Parents and godparents (if local) will also need to attend our Baptism Preparation class and complete paperwork. Please contact the Parish Office to begin the process.

BAPTISM SEWING

Are you gifted with the talent of sewing? At Most Precious Blood we sew our own Baptismal Cloths that are given to the children at their Baptism. Our cloths are made from the same material as the linens on the Altar and the embroidered cross on the cloth is also the same as the cross on the Altar linens. We are in need of both sewers for



the cloth and/or embroiderers for the cross. All material and embroidery thread is supplied. Our sewers pray for each child as they sew the Baptism cloths. BAPTISM TEAM

Our Baptism Team assists families on the day of Baptism. The team member arrives before Mass to set up the seating and materials for the family. They greet the family upon their arrival and review with the parents and godparents the Ritual and responses. Training is provided for all team members. Baptisms are celebrated the first weekend of the month and our team

volunteers sign up to assist at the Mass they typically attend on that weekend if they are available. This is a joyful ministry as team members get to assist a family that is having their child baptized into the Sacramental life of the Catholic Church! BECOMING CATHOLIC: Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)



RCIA is the process by which the Catholic Church welcomes new members into the community of the faithful! It is available to individuals who are interested in the process of becoming Catholic and seeking

sacramental initiation into the Catholic Church. The process is divided into various periods that respect and support the individual's faith journey. Participants attend weekly sessions and experience the life of the community through participation in Liturgical Rites, shared faith, and Catholic

beliefs. For adults and children over the age of 7 who have never been baptized, the process leads to the completion of the Sacraments of Initiation – Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist – at the Easter Vigil. Those baptized in another Christian faith



make a Profession of Faith and receive the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist through a Rite of Reception into Full Communion at various times throughout the year. Adults who were baptized in the Catholic Faith but have not been catechized are fully initiated and receive the Sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation with the Bishop. Anyone who has a desire to become Catholic can inquire for this process.



Individuals can be those who have never been baptized, persons baptized in another Christian faith, or baptized Catholics who have not received any other sacraments. The Inquiry Period is the informal beginning of the Christian Initiation process. This time enables the Inquirer to ask questions about the faith and discern if this is where God is leading them at this time in their life. RCIA REFRESHMENT MINISTRY

Each week in the Christian Initiation Process (RCIA) individuals seeking to learn more about the Catholic faith meet to study the teachings of the Catholic Church while they discern their desire and calling to become Catholic. During these sessions a break time is scheduled for refreshments and some social time. Parishioners are needed each week to provide snacks and refreshments for our sessions. Won't you consider helping by bringing the gift of hospitality once a month to our wonderful group as these incredible individuals walk their journey of faith? RCIA SPONSOR MINISTRY (<u>Ri</u>te of <u>C</u>hristian <u>I</u>nitiation of <u>A</u>dults)

Sponsors play a crucial role in the Christian initiation process as they guide and mentor Catechumens and Candidates seeking to become Catholic. They are called upon throughout the process to give testimony to the progress and readiness of the participants. Sponsors serve as



a guide and connection between the participants and the parish community. They assist a Catechumen or Candidate by accompanying them along their faith journey through the different periods of the RCIA process.

- A Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age and a fully initiated Catholic, having received the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. Each sponsor must be an active, practicing Catholic in good standing and if married they must have celebrated the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony in the Catholic Church.
- Sponsors attend weekly sessions along with Catechumens and Candidates to help reinforce the Catholic faith and traditions. The role of a sponsor is to become familiar with the stages and periods of the Christian Initiation process, commit to daily prayer for the person they are sponsoring, and to help draw that person into the life of the parish. CURSILLO

Cursillo is an encounter with Christ 'movement' dedicated to spreading the Word of God and helping people form a closer relationship with Jesus. The goal of Cursillo is that Christ be the prime influence in Society. The Cursillo Movement employs a method that emphasizes the importance of a balanced life of piety, continued spiritual study, and action. This "invitation" weekend retreat will change your life. HISPANIC MINISTRY



FAITH FORMATION AND FAMILY LIFE HELP OUR COMMUNITY TO HEAR AND RESPOND TO JESUS' CALL TO "COME, FOLLOW ME" AS HIS DISCIPLES.

CATECHISTS, ASSISTANT CATECHISTS, & HELPERS

Catechists and assistant catechists help others deepen their knowledge of Jesus, grow in their love of Jesus, and faithfully follow Jesus in their daily lives. Helpers usually work outside the classroom in various capacities throughout the year. Any adult can become a catechist or assistant catechist. High school youth can be assistant catechists and helpers. Training is provided throughout the year.

Requirements: Prospective catechists and assistant catechists must be actively living their Catholic faith, eager to learn more about it, and willing to share it. In addition, anyone 15 years and older who works with children must go through the Safe Environment training and fingerprinting process mandated by the Diocese of Orlando.

Catechists and assistants spend about 90 minutes in the classroom per week. In addition, they spend time in prayer and study to prepare for each session. Catechists are also expected to participate in training and enrichment activities provided throughout the year.

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION FOR CHILDREN

The desire to fruitfully receive the Sacraments grows out of lived relationship with Jesus Christ in the context of the Catholic Church. Sacramental preparation builds on the foundation of Faith Formation. After discerning if the child is ready, parents present their children/youth for preparation to receive Reconciliation, Eucharist, or Confirmation in their second consecutive year of Faith Formation enrollment (children must also be at least 7 years of age to begin Reconciliation/First Communion Prep and Confirmation students must be at least in 8th grade). Retreats and preparation sessions are in addition to weekly Faith Formation sessions.

Confirmation

Preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation begins when parents and their youth have discerned an openness to live for Jesus Christ in the world. At Most Precious Blood, preparation for youth is a two-year process, with the sacrament being



received in the second consecutive year of enrollment (typically in the eighth grade). In addition to Faith Formation sessions, candidates for Confirmation participate in a retreat



and catechesis sessions that focus on celebrating the Sacrament of Confirmation and living as a disciple of Jesus Christ in the world. The Bishop schedules the date for the parish celebration of Confirmation.

Reconciliation and Eucharist

Preparation for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist begins when the parents have discerned that their child is able to choose between right and wrong (usually around seven years-old). During the two periods of preparation (one for each Sacrament), at least one parent/ guardian accompanies the child/youth to catechesis sessions and retreats that focus on celebrating the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist for the first time and living it out for the rest of their lives. First Reconciliation is usually received at the end of the fall, and First Eucharist is usually received at the end of the spring. Preparation for these sacraments is a two-year process, with the child receiving the sacraments in the second consecutive year of enrollment. Participation in the catechesis sessions and the retreats is in addition to regular weekly Faith Formation.





ST. ANN MOTHERS FELLOWSHIP

We are a ministry of mothers with children of all ages sharing time in fellowship and fun. The group helps cultivate a support system of mothers within our parish and greater community by participating in social and spiritual activities. We bring mothers together to nourish the love we each have for our families while learning about ourselves as Christian women. Please join us!
